Publication Ethics and Malpractice Statement

1. Duties of Editors

3. Duties of Reviewers

They must not use any unpublished material for personal benefit.

Reviewers are expected to inform the editor about any ethical concerns such as plagiarism, duplicate submission, or data fabrication.

4. Plagiarism and Ethical Misconduct

All submitted manuscripts are checked for plagiarism using reliable tools.

Any form of plagiarism (including self-plagiarism) is strictly prohibited and will lead to rejection or retraction.

Misconduct such as data fabrication, image manipulation, or falsified authorship is unacceptable and will result in permanent blacklisting from the journal.

5. Data Access and Retention

Authors may be asked to provide the raw data in connection with their paper for editorial review and should be prepared to retain such data for a reasonable period after publication.

6. Retraction and Correction Policy

Retraction notices will clearly state the reasons for retraction and who is initiating it.

8. Copyright and Licensing
